

#### Reduced Rate Info

- DPR offers a reduced rate for summer camps to DC residents who qualify. Visit <a href="mailto:dprsummercamp.com">dprsummercamp.com</a> to find the online application.
- After completing the form, applicants will be contacted by DPR to schedule an appointment to provide the required proof of residency and income.
- Qualifying families will receive either a 50% or 75% discount, depending on income level.
- The application is only for a reduced rate and does NOT secure a spot in camp.
- To receive a reduced rate, residents MUST be approved for the reduced rate BEFORE registering for camp.
