Re: Riggs Rd NE Bike Lanes

Dear Chairperson Fletcher and Commissioners,

Pursuant to the “Administrative Procedure Amendment Act of 2000” D.C. LAW 13-249 (48 DCR 3491 April 20, 2001), the District Department of Transportation (DDOT) is required to give a written Notice of Intent (NOI) on proposed traffic and parking modifications.

DDOT proposes to reconfigure the 100 block of Riggs Road between First Place NE and South Dakota Ave NE to remove the curbside eastbound travel lane for 800 feet, and convert that space to a two-way protected bike lane (aka cycletrack) as shown in the attached plans. The purpose of this change is to create a dedicated and safer connection for people biking under the railroad tracks to reach the Metropolitan Branch Trail. This will reduce conflicts between people walking and people biking on the sidewalk.

We are issuing this NOI at the 30% design stage to solicit public feedback through the ongoing development stages of this project.

Proposed cross sections for the project are shown below:

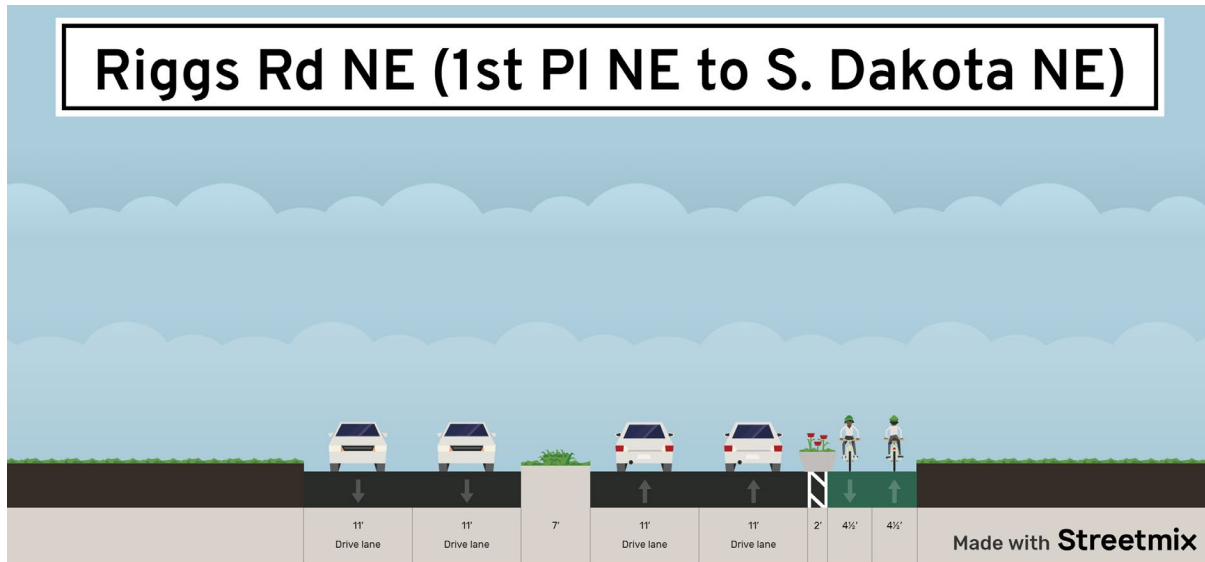


Figure 1 The protected bike lane will run on the south side to utilize excess lane capacity on Riggs Rd NE (planter shown for illustration purposes only).

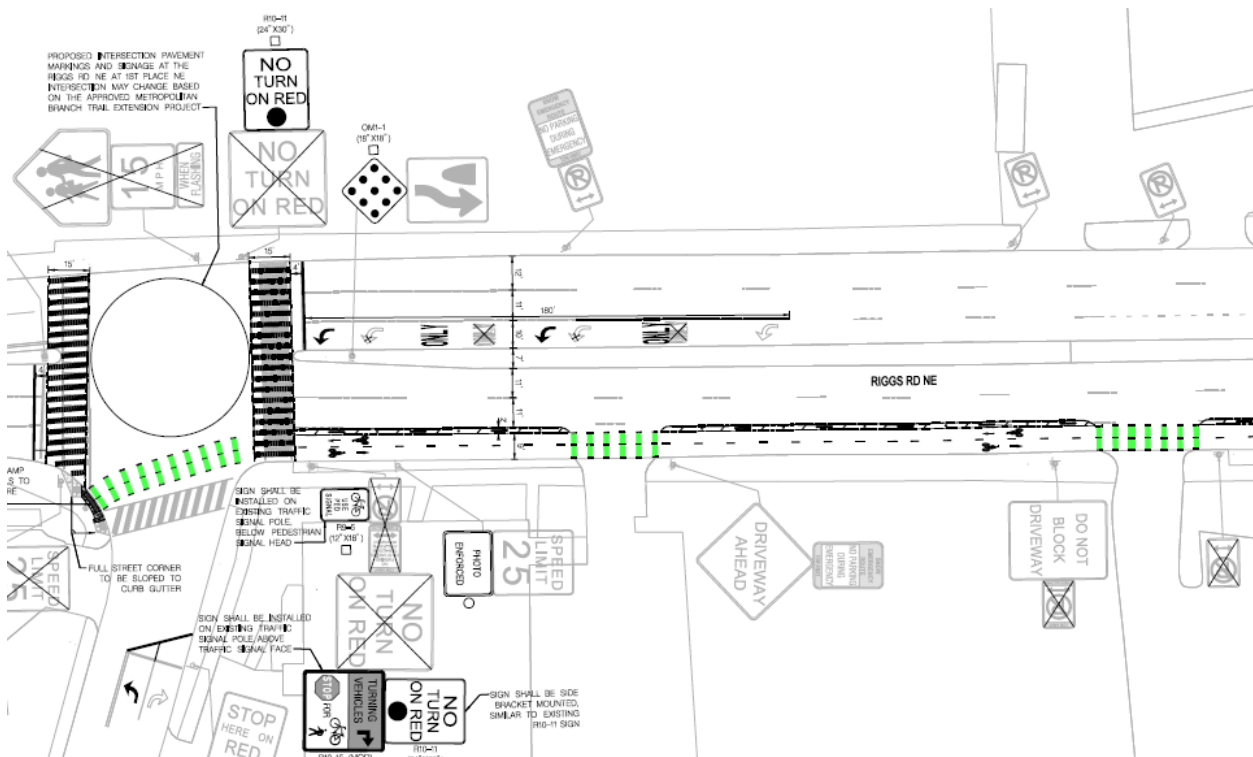
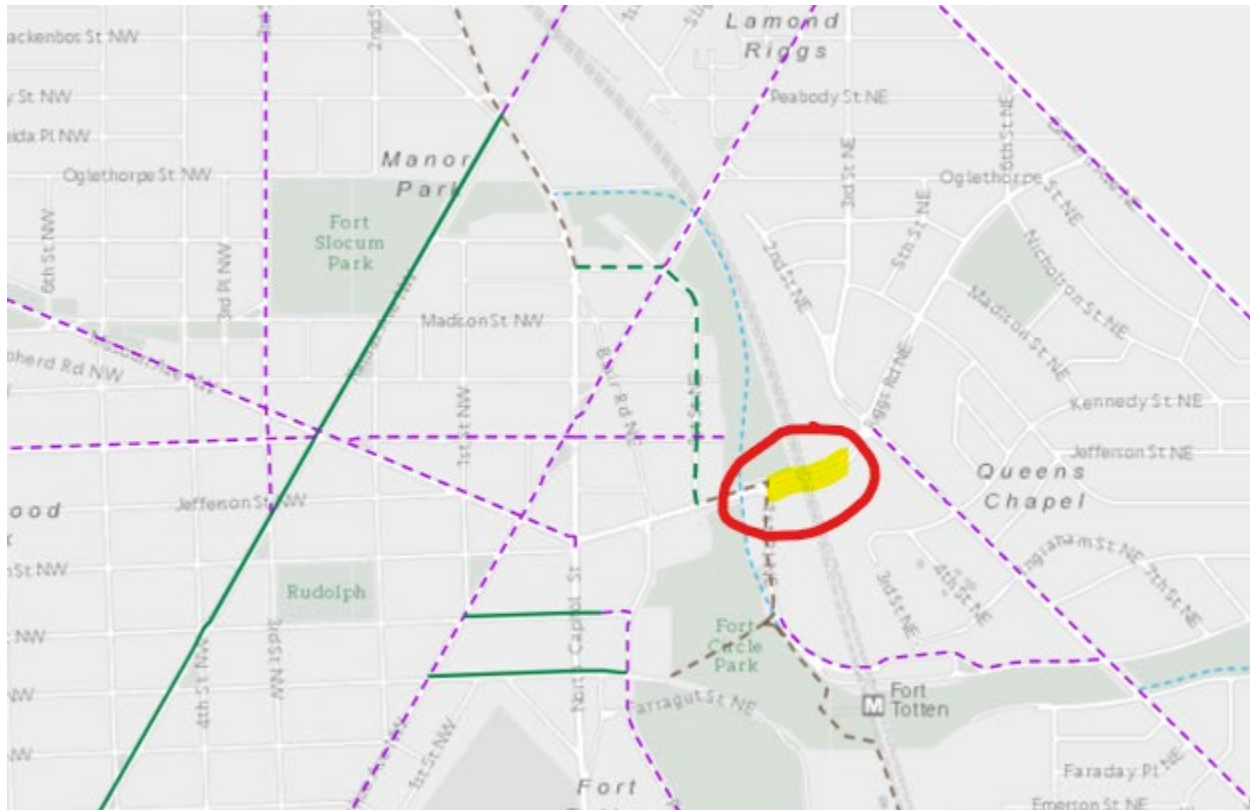


Figure 2 Bike Lanes will connect to future phase of Metropolitan Branch Trail at First Place NE
