What can we do to improve Public Safety in our Community!

- Update street lighting (requested)
- Input crime camera along commercial area (requested)
- Identify licensed group homes in the community (requested)
- Installation of air tags for autos / dogs (first round of free give-a-way for NMP by MPD was 3-14)
- Be aware of crime that happens in the community
- If you see something, say something. Report it to 911
- Leave porch lights on at night
- Always secure your vehicle. (clubs, alarms)
- Install security cameras
- Get to know your neighbors

Be an aware citizen by staying informed.

The first step in any emergency is to stay informed. When you are aware of what is going on around you, you are able to make decisions involving the safety of your family and loved ones. Should you evacuate or shelter in place? Do you need to stock up on milk and bread or plastic sheeting and duct tape? Apply for the city's FREE private security camera program

It encourages residents, businesses, non-profits, churches to install cameras on their property and register them with the Metro. Pol. Depart. (MPD). A measure to deter crime and assist victims of crimes.

How you can participate

- The Private Security Camera Rebate Program provides a rebate for the purchase, installation of security cameras on your property. The rebate is up to \$200/camera, with a max rebate of up to \$500 per residential address (e.g. home offices, condo buildings and apartments) and \$750 for all other eligible addresses.

- The Private Security Camera Voucher Program provides a security camera system to eligible residents Free of Charge! Residents (owners or tenants) who get public assistance, may be eligible to have a camera system installed!
